COMMENTARY CORNER: GLORY IN THE CHURCH SERIES: "FOLLOWERS OF THE

CHURCHES OF GOD" "For ye, brethren, became followers of the churches of God which in Judaea are in Christ Jesus: for ye also have suffered like things of your own countrymen, even as they have of the Jews: Who both killed the Lord Jesus, and their own prophets, and have persecuted us; and they please not God and are contrary to all men" (1 Thessalonians 2:14–15).

Jesus invited men to follow him from the beginning of his ministry. Those encouraged included Peter, Andrew, James and John (Matthew 4:18–22) as well as Matthew (Matthew 9:9). In the case of the first four, they left their jobs as fishermen and followed Jesus. Matthew left the work of being a tax collector to follow Jesus. And Jesus informed these that they would follow him to become fishers of men (Matthew 4:19).

The decision to follow Jesus was the best decision anyone could make, though followers were warned that following Jesus could sometimes be perilous, even putting the follower in a position of being hated (Matthew 10:22). Indeed Jesus wanted the apostles to know that whatever they did to Jesus as leader, they would do to his disciples as followers: He informs: "If the world hate you, ye know that it hated me before it hated you" (John 15:18).

It is true that following another can be both perilous and precarious. Precarious, that is, uncertain, because we do not always know how following another will end. This is what is behind the warning, "be careful who you follow."

When one follows another, or a company follows the path of another, or a group of people follow the practices of others, warnings are usually offered. There are times when following results in a good outcome. There are other times when following can destroy even religious people. Remember Peter wrote to the churches, "And many shall follow their pernicious ways; by reason of whom the way of truth shall be evil spoken of" (2 Peter 2:2).

We agree that following can have good and bad consequences. And there are a number of sayings warning the same: "Be a leader and not a follower" is advice given. "Don't be a follower" is a warning offered. "Why follow another when you can chart your own course?" the querists asks. There are plenty enough admonitions against being followers in our time.

The Apostle John offers an alternative view, assuming that following, really, is a part of life, it is inevitable. He writes, "Beloved, follow not that which is evil, but that which is good. He that doeth good is of God: but he that doeth evil hath not seen God" (3 John 11). We suggest to others that following is a part of life, even in the lives of people who insist that they follow none but themselves.

What happens in life then is not that we have a choice of whether we will follow or not. It involves, instead, questions over who and what we will follow. This is the reason we encourage our children not to be followers. We are talking about not following who and what is not good to follow. But follow we will. And Jesus admonished others to follow him.

We read in Scripture that Jesus encouraged people to follow him. But so too did Paul. Remember he wrote, "Be ye followers of me, even as I also am of Christ" (1 Corinthians 11:1)? Paul did not encourage his readers to simply follow him, but to follow him as he was of Christ (1 Corinthians 11:1). Should we not also encourage that when following others takes place it should be because of the persons and principles they follow related to God.

Paul wrote of those principles: "Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace, and things wherewith one may edify another" (Romans 14:19). Paul wrote to his son in the gospel: "But thou, O man of God, flee these things, and follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness" (1 Timothy 6:11). He demonstrates that others are involved in the same: "Flee also youthful lusts: but follow righteousness, faith, charity, peace, with

them that call on the Lord out of a pure heart" (2 Timothy 2:22). Timothy follows virtues with others who follow the same virtues.

In our studies on the church and the glory God gets in it by Christ Jesus, we discover that it is not only the Lord who should be followed, or apostles who can be followed (1 Thessalonians 1:6), but even churches can be followed (1 Thessalonians 2:14–15). And there will be something even more interesting about the word translated in the English as "follow" in this text.

The Greek word that describes the following the Apostles, Peter, Andrew, James, and John are encouraged to do is hopiso, as in to come behind. The word used for Matthew is akoloutheo, a word used to describe "to follow" or "to accompany." A compound of akoloutheō is used in 2 Peter 2:2 where Peter writes of many following pernicious ways. Another Greek word translated "follow" in the English text is mimeomai, having to do with imitating and following an example, as is used in 3 John 11, a text where the believers are not to "follow" evil, or "imitate" evil, but good. Paul uses this same verb in his writing to the Thessalonians.

He says that the Thessalonians "followed," "imitated," or "conducted themselves" like the apostles (1 Thessalonians 1:6). Then he writes that the believers became followers or imitators of the churches of God that are in Judea in Christ Jesus (1 Thessalonians 2:14). We have in this observation of the text, one group of believers following in the steps, or having similar behavior to, believers in another church. This observation establishes truths about the importance of the churches.



COMMENTARY CORNER

In the communication to the Thessalonians, we come to understand that churches are entities in and of themselves. Each church has an individual existence. It is a real organism, functioning for the benefit of those who make up its membership. The church has an identity, with the most important characteristic of its identity being its existence in Christ.

We learn further that churches can conduct themselves in ways that are either beneficial, or not, for other churches. The Thessalonians were told that they followed or mirrored the behavior of the churches of God in Judea that were in Christ (1 Thessalonians 2:14).

Churches can set examples, and churches can follow the example of churches around them. We must not forget that churches that are in Christ have a connection with one another.

although separated by certain boundaries, geography, and topography. What they have in common is Christ Jesus. Churches, then, should not think of themselves as churches that have no affiliation with other churches of Christ.

Church members should appreciate that there is affiliation as they live for Christ and move from one city to the next. They can associate with churches that have similar beliefs, practices, and experiences they are accustomed to. This is especially important for the man and woman, husband and wife, mother and father who live their lives in the context of church life. It is important for those who understand that faith life in the church is a way of life that involves the whole family.

There is something more that should not be missed. When Paul writes that the Thessalonian church was following the churches of God in Judea in Christ, he does so as part of his

teaching about certain persecutions and problems believers can face (1 Thessalonians 2:14– 15). We certainly need in our time examples of people who understand that life includes facing difficult times. And that difficult times are to be met with understanding that through Christ, all who follow him, will be victorious, they will overcome, they will win. We learn a lot from churches that maintain faith in Iesus Christ.

We learn much too from churches that follow Christ, that follow the apostles, and that follow churches that are faithful to Christ Jesus. All churches then should celebrate their existence, their fellowship, the churches they follow, and the examples they set for others.

Finally, we have acknowledged that following does not have to be a bad behavior. Let us follow that understanding with a willingness to encourage ourselves to be people who can follow and who can be followed.
