

COMMENTARY CORNER: DEVOTIONS IN THE GOSPEL OF MARK: A STUDY SERIES #11 "THE SOWER AND THE WORD: AUDIOLOGY, CARDIOLOGY, AND

POLMOLOGY" (#2) "And these are they which are sown on good ground; such as hear the word, and receive it, and bring forth fruit, some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some an hundred" (Mark 4:20).



Children of God today can similarly please God by bearing fruit. The prescription given in the days of Jesus is just as effective today. And we should not take lightly what Jesus instructed about any aspect leading to bearing fruit. The first necessity, then, is where one must begin. There is the need to hear. But not just anything, the person must hear the word of God. We have already examined the truth that people of God are blessed when they hear the word of God. There may be other narratives that are beneficial to life. For the child of God, however, there will be no fruit production to the glory of God unless that person hears the word of God.

Hearing the word, must be followed by reception of the word. This mandate must be understood as something more than merely knowing what was said, like, "love your enemies." A disciples quizzed about what a message was about can answer that the word taught encouraged that a child of God love his or her enemy. But to produce fruit, the person cannot just know the right words, that person must manifest and live the right actions. To receive the word, is to apply that word in a believer's life.

The church is often confused about

this aspect of fruit bearing. Adults are witnesses of the number of times children have reviewed before the church, giving all the right answers to barrages of questions hurled at him and her on a Sunday morning; or perhaps at a bible bowl. Parents and mentors smile at the depth of recall the young person has.

The young person who has heard can give the names of people, the names of places, the events resulting in victory, the proximity of God to pain and sorrow. And the adults are convinced that a beautiful life awaits the child so performing before the church. But the warm and congratulatory feeling comes to an abrupt disruption when it is discovered that the same child who has spent his or her formative years in the church has now renounced spiritual life and lives as if there is no God. We should remind ourselves that there is a difference between hearing and receiving.

The adult is snagged in the same scenario. In the hearing moment, the adult will hear what it is to have a devotional and spiritual relationship with the Lord. The adult can hear what is involved in being a godly spouse, and exemplary employee, an honest citizen, and a caring neighbor. The adult can repeat what the preacher said about being involved in ministry, giving toward the kingdom, sharing the gospel with the lost, encouraging the saints, and being faithful through life's circumstances.

But that same adult, however, who has heard the word preached and taught becomes caught up in an extra marital affair, criminal activity on the job, neglecting civic duty, and refusing to be

kind to a neighbor. Added to these ungodly behaviors is the ability for the person who has heard to be slothful in ministry, without purpose in giving, unconcerned about sharing the gospel, uncommitted to building up saints, and unfaithful when trouble comes. This adult is affected by the same hearing and receiving dysfunction as the young person who dismays adults who have invested so much in him or her.

There is a difference between hearing and receiving. And there is evidence and production when a person has heard and received. Jesus calls that evidence fruit. And we must remember not to equate fruit bearing with lip service. Which is what we have been examining. In the case of the young person, she knows everything that has been said to her in life. And can repeat it. In the case of the adult, that adult has been heard saying that he knows the Bible better than the people who come to church. What he means by this, of course, is that he has heard what was said. We underscore and embolden, again, however, that simply hearing is not what leads to fruit. The man and woman, the boy and girl must receive it. It must become a matter of the word informing the heart to the extent that the word governs the actions.

Jesus distinguished heart service from lip service with these words: "Ye hypocrites, well did Esaias prophesy of you saying, This people draweth nigh unto me with their mouth, and honoureth me with their lips, but their heart is far from me" (Matthew 15:7–8).



COMMENTARY CORNER

The heart becomes a dispositive factor. We emphasized the cardiological aspect of fruit bearing in our first installment of this series of lessons. Fruit bearing must take into consideration audiology, the ability to hear, and cardiology, which is also the ability to hear. It is the right audiology and cardiology that lead to the ability to engage in polmology, which engages the physical and spiritual sciences of fruit bearing.

Let us note that there is a difference between physical hearing and spiritual hearing. Physical hearing is limited to our ears. Our ears, in simple construction, are able to perform by way of the outer ear, the tympanic membrane. The outer ear is aided by the middle ear, the tympanic center. But

the outer ear and middle ear cannot perform their function for hearing unless there whether our ears and heart function on a is the inner ear, the cochlea. In short, then, the outer ear transmits sound to the middle ear which transmits sound to the inner ear. But there is yet another factor in hearing. The ear can capture sounds, but it takes the heart, the mind, to discern meaning in the sounds.

Our study is not about the physical heart in this instance. It is not about four chambers of the heart that involve two upper chambers, the left and right atria. It is not about the two lower chambers, the left and right ventricles. Neither is the discerning heart the four valves: the tricuspid, pulmonary, mitral, and aortic. These chambers and valves can be functioning at optimum level and one still not be spiritually healthy.

What Jesus has reference to is not physical level. What Jesus illuminates is how our minds receive the word of God. The truth is that my inner ear, the tympanic membrane, the tympanic center, and the cochlea can all be functioning well. The left and right atria, the left and right ventricles, the tricuspid, pulmonary, mitral and aortic valves can all be functioning so as to please the doctor, and still I can be unhealthy, unproductive and unfruitful.

When I become fruitful in life is dependent on how my heart, my mind, my spiritual senses respond to the word of God. We shall explore this thought even further in our next installment. At this point, let us acknowledge that I must both hear and receive the word to be fruitful.
