

COMMENTARY CORNER: "THE AGES OF FAMILY AND LIFE" "These words spake his parents because they feared the Jews: for the Jews had agreed already, that if any man did confess that he was Christ, he should be put out of the synagogue. Therefore said his parents, He is of age; ask him" (John 9:22-23).



Jesus, when an adult, healed a man that was born blind, and here would be another occasion when a parent would acknowledge that a difficult situation was best handled by listening to a son. They replied to the Pharisees, "He is of age; ask him" (John 9:23). When it comes to life, there are ages when parents speak for their children, are responsible for their children, and determine how the child should live. But this is not for life.

Any child who lives long enough realizes that he comes of age. He comes to an age when training, nurturing, instruction, and rearing come together to form the older person whose decisions reflect the commitment he has to principles and values. This is a lesson for adults of all ages. On the one hand we see the need to supervise, guide, and instruct. On the other, we realize that sons and daughters must eventually make decisions for themselves.

It is clear that for a time, Moses was known as the son of Pharaoh's daugh-

ter. Instructing us in what happens when he was come of age, the Bible reads, "By faith Moses, when he was come to years, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter; Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season" (Hebrews 11:24-25). Moses' decisions and choices are those of a much older child.

All parents would that children would mature and make wise choices, choices that reflect that children have been reared in the nurture and admonition of the Lord (Ephesians 6:4). It is the contention of this study that learning the ages of family and life help us to foster environments and opportunities that will help all succeed into the latter vears of life.

It is no secret that for many parents there has been an unwillingness to acknowledge what has always been true of human beings. People are different and have different abilities dependent on their ages. This is true of the infant, toddler, middler, junior, and teen. It is also true of the young, mature, middle age, and senior adults. While we know how mature and senior adults should conduct themselves, there has been some negligence in understanding when it comes to others.

The misunderstanding not only affects the family, it also affects what is done in the church. Unwise church practices and structures can result in a destructive church environment resulting in immature Christians and discour-

aged members, members who fall away.

Over the years, understanding the ages of the family has affected whether a church believes all must have Bible class together, whether there will be children's worship, whether it is appropriate to have youth groups, what kind of money should be spent on age appropriate study materials, the amount of money budgeted to meet the needs of differing age groups—and the list goes on.

Age appropriate ministry structures is a very important matter to consider. It affects the timing of classes (for churches that have them), the structure of the building: will there be a nursery, rooms provided for teens to hang out, senior citizen accommodations, and the like?

There is good news for the child of God on this subject. The Bible gives us insight into expectations for people of all ages, including children. The word of God shows that God is keenly aware of how life is lived as an infant, a child, and an adult. This will help us in our expectations of one another.

Let us begin by noting that the Bible gives us children at very differing ages with differing needs and expectations. Infants are in the care of the mothers and fathers, nursed and cared for by them. Even Jesus had to be nursed and cared for as an infant (Luke 2:16–20; Matthew 2:11).



COMMENTARY CORNER

Expecting that Jesus was about the age of a toddler, Herod had all children two years and under slaughtered, (Matthew 2:16). It is important to note that children grow through these toddler years to be able to choose between what is good and what is bad.

Isaiah demonstrates that children are not born knowing everything that is right and wrong. He prophesies of destructions that would come before a young child knew to choose between right and wrong. The Bible record reads; "Butter and honey shall he eat, that he may know to refuse the evil, and choose the good.

For before the child shall know to refuse the evil, and choose the good, the land thou abhorrest shall be forsaken of both her kings" (Isaiah 7:15, 16).

The apostle Paul gives insight into the truth that children and adults don't talk, understood, or think alike. He writes, "When I was a child, I spake as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child: but when I became a man, I put away childish things"(1 Corinthians 13:11).

During the restorations of Ezra and Nehemiah, it is evident that some people are able to understand the reading of the Law and others are not: "He read it aloud from daybreak till noon as he faced the square before the Water Gate in the presence of the men, women and others who could understand" (Nehemiah 8:3).

We are striving to understand how we should interact with infants, toddlers as it relates to sharing the word of God. We know that Jesus demonstrates an interest in children who were probably of middler and junior age as it instructs his disciples to allow the children to come to him (Mark 10:14).

Understanding these ages will help us to answer questions about Bible schools, nurseries, ministries, building structures and a host of other family age related issues. Pray that God gives us insight to prepare our children to come to age making godly decisions.
